Prof Meerten B. ter Borg

Prof. ter Borg has recently stepped down as professor of noninstitutional religion at Leiden University. He is a prolific author of books and articles on implicit religion and sense-making, in Dutch. In English he has published in *Implicit Religion, Sociological Analysis* and in the *Oxford Handbook of The Sociology of Religion*.

Prof. Mackor has been professor of professional ethics, with particular attention for the legal professions, at the faculty of law of Groningen University since 2009. Since 2004 she is the Socrates professor of professional ethics at the Faculty of Theology and Religious studies and the Faculty of Philosophy at the same university.
